City of Science Aachen truly is a city of 🛛 • 🌶 students! With more than 58,000 students from all walks of life and all corners of the world, the city is full of young people, ideas and innovation. The RWTH Aachen University is one of the largest in Germany and a centre for engineering, science and technology. So cliché, but that's possibly why there are so many boys in the city. As a saying goes:

»There's an engineer for every girl in Aachen!« During the last few years the university has been expanded on a large scale, a number of modern centres have been built for

different institutions, like 🗧 Super C and F CARL, one of the largest auditoriums in Europe. There are three main clusters of the campus, near the city centre, at Hörn and Melaten.

Campus Melaten is a vast site (as big as the city centre) for lots of different institutions and the Uniklinikum (teaching hospital). Built in the 70s in the style of »technical modernity« (like Centre Pompidou in Paris) it is a monument of »high-tech architecture«, a huge and frankly bizarre hospital. Would you have expected a hospital to look like this?

Gain insight into interesting science projects and research programmes concerning engineering, material science and aviation at RWTH with the future lab app (futurelab-aachen.de/flapp), a sciency city guide. It's free and available in English, too! To get a glimpse of what's life like as a student just wander around the campus and Pontstraße. We'll be there!

only open during the holidays, 10:00–18:00, Mon 10:00–14:00] If you walk straight through the treasury you'll find a beautiful hidden gem, the schoolyard (probably the most beautiful ever) of »Domsingschule«, a primary school.

1 History Lesson

open Tue-Sunl *Centre Charlemagne* is a museum that hows Aachen's important role in history. Our city developed from a Roman settlement and spa, became the medieval imperial residence of emperor Charles he Great (aka Charlemagne) and thus, for a long period of time the place where 81 Holy Roman Emperors were crowned Kings of the Germans. This is a great place to learn about Aachen's past and everything that lead to its character today and it's connection to the European spirit. Centre Charlemagne hosts great temporary exhibitions too, mostly about not-solong-ago local history like smuggling in our region or Aachen's youth movements after WWII. They're always worth a visit!

MP Rathaus

The town hall of the city hosts the »Krönungssaal«, a hall of kings, two baroque, ishly decorated halls and the assembly hall which is still the residence of the City Council. On weekends (especially in summer) you'll see the staircase covered in white glitter, confetti and flowers and bridal couples taking pictures with all of their wedding guests.

WKatschhof

A square enclosed by the cathedral, the town hall and other historic buildings: the heart of the historical city centre. From here you'll have the best view on the cathedral. Fime for your Instagram story update?



Dom zu Aachen

The antique star of the show! Even if you're not overly interested in old churches, you have to take a look inside! You'll be amazed by the beautiful golden mosaic ceiling giving an impressively beautiful air to the monumental halls. Looking up, standing in the centre of the octagon you'll see what people in the Middle Ages imagined heave o be like. A little more humble at first sigh is Charlemagne's throne up on the gallery, but made out of marble slabs from the hol city of Jerusalem. The Aachen Cathedral was the church of coronation for German kings and queens for about 600 years, a true centre of political power and 🛛 👩 significance. Built in 800, the cathedral is one of the oldest in Europe. So there are lots of stories about the cathedral that have been passed on for

generations. Legend has it tha the people of Aachen built it with the help of the devil and tricked him in the end, so that, when he slammed the door leaving the church in a blind fury (notice the crack in the great portal?), he pinched his thumb. You can still feel it inside the right door andle.

Möschbrunnen

Mösch« translates to »sparrow« in the Aachen dialect. You can drink the water rom this little adorable fountain.

Dizza please [open every day]

If you are looking for the best pizza in town - wood-fired-oven-baked, simply crisp and delicious – *Luigi's Pizza* is the place to go!

Tatisserie Parfait

[open every day] Even if you don't make it inside, you have to take a look at the shop window, you'll be amazed by all of the picture-perfect Belgian cakes and »petit fours« (dwarf-sized colourful pastries) at *Café van den Daele*.

[open Mon-Sat] Treat yourself to a very special barber experience at *Baderknechte*, a barber shop with a stylish industrial design interior and extraordinary service.

Am Knipp is the oldest inn in Aachen! Its interior is decorated with tiles, copper jugs, woodcarvings and painted china – making for a really authentic experience.

Legend has it that the Bahkauv jumps on the back of drunk men at night. So watch out when walking home from Pontstraße.

31 Elisenbrunnen

Can you smell it? Aachen is known for its hot mineral springs that have been frequented since Roman times. Even the name »Aachen« descends from Old High German »ahha« meaning »water«. Latin »Aquae« figures in Aachen's Roman name »Aquae granni«, which meant »waters of Grannus«, referring to the Celtic god of healing who was worshipped at the springs. Even Casanova himself visited Aachen to recover from his STDs. If you pay attention to the marble engravings inside the pavilion, you'll find his name there.

Printen from Aachen

Why should you limit your consumption of gingerbread to the festive months of Christmas? Printen can be enjoyed all year round! There are lots of bakeries in Aachen baking printen, like the family-run bakery K Klein, L Alois Roderburg, M Moss or *Nobis*. Have a look at their shop window, it always looks like a little treasure chest. Printen are made from a range of spices, sugars, flour and water and were initially made as decorations (as they don't go off) until someone realised that they taste pretty amazing, too!

32 Baths of Art Nouveau

open Mon–Šat, 3,50/2,30€] This is a really unique experience! in the Art Nouveau era that are still open to James Bond, Alfred Hitchcock the public and super cheap. Take a header or Stanley Kubrick films into the past!

3 Brauhaus

35 Altertümchen

pen Thu-Sat] Have a browse through *Möbel Tante*, an adorable shop for refurbished vintage urniture and homeware with a back story.

German beer culture is worldamous of course, but German beer is only ever made according to the German purity aw: Beer must only be made from water, arley, yeast and hops. Our Belgian eighbours are a little more experimental with their brewing, adding ingredients ike raspberry or cherry, making for a mpletely different experience.

You may call *Maier Peveling's* a gourmet hippy, serving French fries with truffle mayo or gourmet Currywurst, run by chef Christof Lang, Patron of »La Becasse«, one of Aachen's Michelin Star restaurants. If you like, you can enjoy some champagne with your fries.

Sustainable and Organic

There are lots of organic supermarkets and shops in Aachen! Alnatura, Denn's, basic, Vital, Quer-korn, Sonnentor (organic supermarkets), Weltladen and Contigo (fairtrade shops).
